FAQ Tuition fees

How much do my studies at CS cost?

The cost of studying at CentraleSupélec is made up of 2 main elements:

- The registration fee, plus the Student and Campus Life Contribution (95 euros each year).
- The monthly living expenses. As an indication, Campus France estimates the monthly budget for a student in the Paris region at between 1000 and 1200 euros/month (excluding APL-type subsidies), depending on the type of accommodation chosen. On the Metz and Rennes campuses, rents and living costs are lower;
- Non-European students also have to pay the tax stamp for the visa (50 euros in 2021-2022) and 75 euros for the residence permit renewal.

To find out which grants you are eligible for, please consult the « Toutes mes aides » application (https://app.toutesmesaides.fr/bienvenue), which lists all the contributions you are eligible for according to your nationality and financial situation.

What happens if I want to stop my course at CS?

Any year started is due.

How do I pay my tuition fees?

There are several ways to pay your tuition fees:

<u>Online payment</u>: this is done by Paybox and can be done in one or three installments:

- In one installment, the payment will be made the same day
- In 3 installments (1/3 debited on the same day, 1/3 debited at the end of the 2nd month, and the 3rd third debited at the end of the 3rd month). If you choose this solution, you must inform us before 30 September 2022.

Payment of the registration fee must be made by 31/12/2022 at the latest.

Payment by bank transfer

If you anticipate difficulties in paying your registration fees, we invite you to come and explain your difficulties to the SGAE as soon as possible so that we can determine the best possible solution for you.

Do I have to pay registration fees if I am on a gap year?

During your gap year, you must pay part of the registration fees at CentraleSupélec. The registration fees are set at half the full rate, i.e., 1750 Euros for European students and 2950 Euros for non-EU students.

Do I have to pay registration fees if I study outside the School (dual or DD)?

Yes, the registration fee is reduced by half.

Please note: your registration at the School is necessary as long as the School has not officially declared you a graduate. The graduation commissions take place until April. If you have not graduated by this date, you will have to register at the School for the year N+1.

I have a scholarship, do I have to pay the registration fee?

You do not have to pay your registration fees if you are a grant holder on social criteria, CEC, or BGF. For other types of registration, there are separate agreements: total or partial payment of registration fees by a third party, payment of a grant by a third party to ensure payment, Do not hesitate to contact the SGAE for further information.

I am waiting for my scholarship certificate, do I have to pay my registration fees?

You must pay the registration fee if you are waiting for a scholarship decision. These would be returned to you as soon as you receive your scholarship certificate if the scholarship awarded falls within the framework of the exemption from registration fees.

Is payment of the CVEC compulsory?

The contribution pour la Vie étudiante et de Campus (CVEC) was introduced by the government to promote social, health, cultural, and sports support for students.

The payment of the CVEC (95 Euros in 2022-2023) is compulsory for students outside of continuing education or professionalization contracts.

Students are not required to pay this contribution. Scholarship holders on social criteria, French Government Scholarship holders, refugees, people benefiting from subsidiary protection, and asylum seekers are exempt from paying the CVEC but must log in to obtain a CVEC attestation number.

I am a foreigner who has been resident in France for at least three years. How do I pay the EU rate?

Non-European students (fiscally domiciled in France for at least two years, on 1 January preceding the beginning of the academic year of registration or attached to a fiscal household meeting the same conditions) can obtain a reduction in their registration fees at the EU rate upon presentation of the following documents:

In case of tax residence:

- The student's three tax notices for 2020, 2021, and 2022 relating to income for the years 2019, 2020, and 2021 (sent by the tax authorities during the summer) or notice of tax status (ASDIR, a document that can be downloaded when the declaration is made online)
- The valid residence permit

In case of attachment to a French tax household:

 The three tax notices of the tax household domiciled in France to which the person is attached for 2019, 2020, and 2021 relating to income for the years 2018, 2019, and 2020 (sent by the tax authorities during the summer) or notice of tax status (ASDIR, a document that can be downloaded when filing online)

- A copy of a tax return on which the civil status of the connected person must be mentioned, in particular, if the return was made by the internet (the return made by the internet is available in the individual tax account and can therefore be reprinted)
- The valid residence permit

The application must be sent to the SGAE by 31/12/2022 at the latest.
